



Scavenger Hunt Hints

As you ride along the Thames Valley Parkway, you can look for 20 interesting things. The hints below should help you to find them:

- A “Train Station” with a clock on the tower.
 - West side of the Storybook Gardens parking lot.
- A “castle” from a storybook.
 - East side of the Storybook Gardens parking lot.
- A statue of a slippery seal.
 - In the pond, outside the Storybook Gardens main entrance.
- Old Mother Hubbard’s shoe house.
 - Inside Storybook Gardens, but you can see it from outside, on the TVP.
- The “Springbank Pumphouse” historical plaque.
 - The pumphouse is the small building just east of Storybook Gardens. The plaque is on the east side of the building.
- A “Share the Pathway” sign.
 - Many, along the TVP.
- At least 64 geese and 16 ducks.
 - Throughout the park. It will be difficult to NOT see them – avoiding them will be the hard part!
- The “George Wenige” historical sign.
 - In the Wonderland Gardens area, near Wonderland Road, on the section of the path by the old rowing club building.
- An old bandshell.
 - Wonderland Gardens, on the west side of Wonderland Road, north of Springbank Road.
- A sign that tells you how far it is to Halifax and Victoria.
 - At the Terry Fox memorial, east of Wonderland Road, in the Saturn Park area.

- The “Marathon of Hope” sign.
 - At the Terry Fox memorial, east of Wonderland Road, in the Saturn Park area.
- An old boat anchor.
 - On the north side of the TVP path, about halfway between Wonderland Road and Wharncliffe Road.
- A memorial plaque to a London artist and cyclist.
 - At the south end of the tunnel under the railroad tracks, where the TVP meets Horton.
- A very unique fence made of wood.
 - On the north side of the TVP, just east of Richmond Street.
- Two “Beware of Flying Discs” signs.
 - The TVP passes through a ‘Disc Golf’ area, a little bit west of Highbury Ave.
- The “Meadowlily Bridge” historical sign.
 - Meadowlily Bridge is a historical site just east of Highbury Ave. You have to cross the bridge to the south side of the river to find the sign.
- Two “London’s Cycling History” signs.
 - There are two – one just west of Wonderland Road and one between Wharncliffe Road and The Forks.
- Two signs describing the history of “The Forks”.
 - There are two, both of them on the lower TVP path, just west of The Forks.
- Five “historical” signs.
 - There are several along the route.
- Two wrought iron bridges.
 - One is the King Street pedestrian bridge, near The Forks and the other is the Meadowlily Bridge.
- Count how many bridges you cross over.
 - I think the answer is ‘4’ for the provided ‘Ride the TVP’ route.
- Count how many bridges you pass under (tunnel counts as an ‘under’).
 - I think the answer is ‘11’ for the provided ‘Ride the TVP’ route.
